

Fundația FARA began its work in Romania in 1991 and has since grown into a strong non-profit organization with national-level involvement and programmes grounded in the country's realities. Vulnerable groups including children with or without disabilities, young people, adults with disabilities, and their families—are at the heart of FARA's mission. Their needs, challenges, and future shape the organization's impact model.

The general framework of intervention across all programmes seeks to ensure that every beneficiary—regardless of gender, age, background, circumstances, personal views, or preferences—has access to a basic quality of life. Therefore, our work focuses on providing social, emotional, and material support that complements the services available through the social protection system. The programmes implemented by Fundaţia FARA aim to create positive impact that is equally relevant for individuals, their families, communities, and society at large.

Over the past 33 years of activity in Romania, Fundaţia FARA has transformed more than 23,000 lives and created over 300 jobs for dedicated professionals who have become part of the beneficiaries' lives.





A FAMILY FOR LIFE

We provide residential care in a family-like environment, alongside psychosocial support, non-formal education, and opportunities for social interaction for adults with disabilities. We work within the community to promote social inclusion and support independent living.

THERAPY & RECOVERY

We support both children with disabilities and their parents throughout the therapeutic process. We help professionals work more effectively with these children and promote social inclusion.

TACKLING POVERTY THROUGH EDUCATION

We provide educational and psycho-social support, non-formal learning opportunities, material aid, and social inclusion activities for disadvantaged and/or marginalized children, their family members, and other professionals involved in their care.

A FAMILY FOR THOSE WITHOUT

We provide residential care, psycho-social support, non-formal education, and social activities in the St. Nicholas Family Home in Suceava, for children and young people from the child protection system who are without parental or family support and care.


SOLIDARITY WITH UKRAINIAN REFUGEES

The Therapy and Recovery Program provides essential support to children with disabilities, their families, and the wider community, addressing the acute shortage of free, tailored public services—especially in rural areas. Through its three dedicated centers, FARA ensures free access to early intervention, rehabilitation, and social inclusion services.

The program follows a family-centered approach, offering direct support to 365 parents and professionals through thematic workshops, ongoing counselling, and material aid—helping to reduce family stress and ensure continuity in therapy. Its innovative and adaptable nature is reflected in the integration of animal-assisted therapies, community-based activities, and multi-sector partnerships.





Through its therapy centers, Fundația FARA has provided free, tailored support for children with disabilities and their families. The interventions focused on creative approaches, the active involvement of parents, and continuing therapy at home.

Multidisciplinary teams worked to improve the children's functionality and facilitate their integration into family life, school, and the wider community. In addition to classical therapies (psychological support, speech therapy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy), children benefited from innovative alternative therapies, such as animal-assisted interventions, aquatic therapy, outdoor sessions, and recreational activities.

relevance and added value

- The programme generates a direct and measurable impact on the development of children with disabilities, as well as on the resilience of their families.
- By promoting social inclusion, adopting a holistic approach, and ensuring the professional quality of interventions, the programme contributes to the realisation of children's rights, prevents institutionalisation, and reduces marginalisation.
- The programme's success is based on the integration of therapeutic components with educational, emotional, social, and community elements, in line with international best practices in the field of disability.
- The model is replicable and scalable, with potential for expansion to other regions or integration into local public policies.





In 2024, FARA continued to provide essential support for children with disabilities and their families through a comprehensive therapy and rehabilitation programme carried out in three rehabilitation centres: Rafael, Emanuel, and St. Theresa. With a dedicated team of therapists, psychologists, speech therapists, and other specialists, we succeeded in offering free, personalised interventions tailored to the needs of each child.

In 2024 Fundația FARA continued to provide essential support for adults with disabilities who require long-term care, as well as for those living in the community who face isolation, lack of resources, and difficulties with integration. Through our two supported living homes in Suceava County (St. Mary – Vadu Moldovei and Elisabeta - Cacica) and through community-based activities, we have created a safe, warm, and inclusive environment where each person is valued and supported to reach their full potential.

A sense of belonging gained through art, nature and community

Beyond the daily support provided to adults with disabilities, in 2024 FARA invested in special projects that brought colour, meaning, and visibility to the lives of our beneficiaries. These initiatives showed that social inclusion can be built through art, nature, education, and collaboration with the community.

Art for Inclusion

3 exhibitions where 19 beneficiaries showcased their artwork in local galleries, in the presence of authorities, partners, and the wider public.

Art and painting workshops involving 30 people with disabilities, facilitated by art teachers and volunteers.

Floral design – **15 beneficiaries learned how to create floral arrangements**, developing practical skills, aesthetic sense, and self-confidence.

Charity carnival – organised together with pupils and teachers, this event brought together young people and adults, with and without disabilities, in creative and social activities.

Therapy through Nature and Movement

Nature therapy – an unforgettable day for 21 beneficiaries, spent in the forest with connecting activities, painting, games, and discussions about dreams and the future.

"Healthy Living through Movement" – outdoor physical exercises aimed at reducing stress, improving stamina, and enhancing overall well-being.

Gardening and creative recycling workshops – hands-on activities that encouraged environmental responsibility and the development of life skills.

Inclusion and Volunteering

Awareness campaigns in schools and rural communities – over 200 students took part in workshops about disability, empathy, and solidarity.

Joint activities with volunteers – from planting fruit trees to recycling initiatives and visits to care homes for the elderly.

"United Voices" event – 52 beneficiaries, professionals, and families came together to review activities and share ideas for the future.

Education as a solution for a better future

Fundaţia FARA continues to transform lives through education, offering constant support to children, teenagers, young people and families from vulnerable environments in Suceava and Ilfov counties. Through educational clubs, emotional support activities, counselling, personal development and material support, we have created a safe and motivating environment where education becomes a real chance for a better life.

We believe that every child deserves the support they need to reach their potential. Through daily access to education, healthy food, formal and nonformal learning opportunities, creative and recreational activities, as well as integrating technology into the educational process, we give children the chance to learn, express themselves and dream of a better future.

At the national level, the program reaches the most vulnerable families, through specific help that consists of support packages, information and social counseling, facilitating access to services and legal rights.







Constant support to learn, play and develop

At FARA, education doesn't stop when children leave the classroom. Through our educational clubs, kindergarten and primary school children find a safe and stimulating space where learning, healthy nutrition, and play go hand in hand. Every day, over 300 children receive individual homework support, access to technology, and creative and recreational activities, all within a friendly environment tailored to their needs.

Children were encouraged to develop their skills through 344 "fun & learn" activities – ranging from communication and digital literacy to the use of VR technology. Emotional support was an integral part of this journey, through both individual and group counselling sessions. Educational packages, along with the gifts received during the holidays, brought joy and strengthened their sense of belonging..

teenagers and young adults

Supporting adolescents and young people is one of our most important missions. Many of them come from vulnerable backgrounds and find themselves at a critical point in life, where the risk of school dropout or social exclusion is very real. In 2024, **75 adolescents and young adults** enrolled in secondary school, high school, or university received personalised support to continue their education and develop key skills for independent living.

With a 100% pass and enrolment rate, these young people took part in emotional counselling sessions, educational workshops, and creative activities that nurtured their talents. Over 114 skill-building workshops – covering topics such as CV writing, digital literacy, financial education, mental health, and recycling - helped prepare them for the challenges of adult life. At the same time, 289 instances of material support complemented the intervention, helping them maintain balance in their daily lives.

Group activities such as LogiSchool, reading workshops, and dance groups offered them a space where creativity, belonging, and self-confidence could flourish. Each young person was encouraged to take part actively, to explore, and to dare.











In 2024, our programme provided concrete and tailored support for hundreds of children, young people, and their families facing hardship. Through integrated interventions, we not only responded to urgent needs but also worked alongside them to build sustainable pathways towards inclusion, confidence, and personal development.



Successful transitions and a soft finalisation of the program

Throughout this year, the programme provided comprehensive and personalised support for a group of children and young people in vulnerable situations. Four siblings, aged between 11 and 16, who were in urgent need of a safe protection alternative, were at the heart of the team's efforts. In parallel, another four young people (both girls and boys) who had left the care system were supported in their transition to independent living in the community, through ongoing monitoring and active support.



> carefully prepared transition

At the end of the year, FARA carefully prepared the transfer of the four siblings to another private social service provider. Close collaboration with the General Directorates of Social Assistance and Child Protection in Suceava and Ilfov ensured that all legal and administrative procedures were followed. The children received emotional support to help them manage the legal transfer process smoothly and positively. Prior to the move, they spent a weekend getting acquainted with the team and children at the new centre.

The transfer took place in early December. The children received packages containing personal items, new supplies, pocket money for unforeseen expenses, and transport was provided under the direct supervision of the Programme Director and a team member.



a team supported and valued in the transition process

The closure process included an assessment of individual skills and the provision of professional alternatives based on the needs of both the organisation and the staff.

Of the programme's six employees (four care workers, the manager, and the social worker), five continued their work within other FARA programmes, successfully integrating into community-based teams.



solidarity with Ukrainian refugees



In a context marked by uncertainty and hardship, Fundaţia FARA provided essential support in 2024 to refugee families from Ukraine, offering not only shelter, but also emotional support, access to basic services, and a sense of belonging to the FARA Family. The programme was implemented in Suceava County, both at the Mihail Centre and within the wider community.

Hello! My name is Rita. I am 48 years old.

φ.

My family consists of four people: myself, my daughter, and my two grandchildren – one is 4 years old and the other is 7 months. We are from Dnipro, Ukraine. In Ukraine, we lived in a single room, in a dormitory. At the moment, we cannot return home, as there are constant bombings in our city. I am classified as having a second-degree disability and, due to my health, I am unable to work. My daughter is on maternity leave, but because of the war, she also lost her job. I have a small pension, which is currently our only source of support, as prices for everything have skyrocketed in our country. My daughter had to divorce due to abuse and is now raising her two children alone, receiving only a very small maintenance allowance.

The war started in February 2022, and we were forced to flee Ukraine. In March of the same year, we arrived in Romania, where we were welcomed with open arms by volunteers who helped us and gave us a place to stay. We received food and hygiene products for four months. Later, the owner of the house informed us that he could no longer support us. We then stayed in another house through the government's 50/20 programme, but that support ended after three months. I was very discouraged when we were left without shelter and didn't know what to do. Fortunately, we heard about FARA and the support it offers. We were housed immediately and provided with everything we needed: first and foremost, a safe and peaceful home, then food, clothes, shoes, medicine, and toys. Here, we found peace – and the children started to laugh again.

Thanks to FARA, we were able to bring calm back into our lives. Here, we have everything we need, we feel safe, and our children are experiencing the childhood that every child deserves. Your support is vital for us right now. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts for every moment of peace you have brought to the lives of all those living in this home.

by war and extreme vulnerability

The families supported through the programme come from extremely fragile social and financial backgrounds. Most have never had a stable home or have lost everything due to the bombings. For these people, life has meant years of insecurity, deprivation, and trauma. This year, FARA provided direct and tangible support to 90 individuals - women, children, and the elderly helping them rediscover meaning, balance, and hope in a safe and humane environment.

residential & community

At the Mihail Centre, 60 individuals – including 24 women and 36 children (15 girls and 21 boys) - received temporary accommodation and daily support. Another 30 people (18 adults – 9 women and 9 men – and 12 children, including 2 with disabilities) were supported within the community in Suceava County. The adults ranged in age from 19 to 72 years, most being over 40, while the children supported were aged from 0 to 14+, with the majority being of kindergarten and primary school age.

The beneficiary families consist of at least two children, accompanied only by their mother and/or grandmother - women who bear alone the burden of survival and protecting the children. Many face serious health issues, ranging from oncological, cardiac, or endocrine conditions to emotional disorders caused by ongoing stress. The children, in turn, present a wide range of health problems - from frequent paediatric infections and dental issues to emotional imbalances and developmental disorders.

The daily support provided included basic necessities such as food, clothing, and hygiene products, as well as covering costs for medical services, emotional counselling, school supplies, toys, access to education, and recreational activities. At the Mihail Centre, 8 women and 12 children received permanent 24/7 accommodation and support in a safe environment tailored to their needs.





Investing in the future

Through its educational scholarship programme, FARA offers more than financial support — it provides confidence, opportunities, and a support network for young people from vulnerable backgrounds who have potential, ambition, and big dreams. In 2024, the programme expanded significantly, reaching young people from 10 counties across the country, offering them not only resources but also a safe space for expression, learning, and personal development.

The programme is coordinated by a dedicated team of five specialists, supported by a communications officer and led by a Programme Manager, the management team, and a strong team of Lenovo volunteers. Together, they create a framework where every young person is encouraged to follow their dreams, regardless of the obstacles.





The impact of the programme was clearly reflected in the lives of the supported scholarship recipients, contributing to the accelerated development of their personal and social skills. They strengthened their selfconfidence, and their sense of belonging to a safe and supportive group grew increasingly strong. Improved access to education and professional opportunities opened up new prospects for their future, while active involvement in the community and decision-making processes marked an important step towards autonomy and full integration.



Each year, Fundația FARA invests in supporting vulnerable children and young people, adults with disabilities, and families. In 2024, 88% of expenses were directed towards direct programmes and projects. The largest allocations were dedicated to therapy and rehabilitation services, educational support programmes, and those aimed at children deprived of parental care.

- Marketing, Fundraising, and Advocacy Expenses



This strong financial support has enabled the continuation and expansion of FARA's interventions, contributing to the transformation of the lives of hundreds of children and young people in need.



The Lenovo STEAM Education Room has become a dynamic and valuable space for the community, serving 335 unique beneficiaries – including children, adolescents, young people, parents, professionals, and other community members. Here, technology is seamlessly blended with education, creativity, and the joy of learning through a wide range of activities: interactive educational sessions, hands-on experiments, film and documentary screenings, arts and crafts workshops, skill-building sessions, and community gatherings.

In addition, 360 primary school pupils had the opportunity to use VR headsets, which stimulated their curiosity, creativity, and critical thinking, offering them a first direct experience with virtual reality. Through these activities, children were not only introduced to innovative technologies but also significantly improved their quality of life and confidence in their own learning and exploration abilities..







Awareness Activities

Health education, environmental stewardship, and civic engagement remained a core focus of our work. We addressed topics vital to the healthy development of children and young people, such as disease prevention and the promotion of a healthy lifestyle during pre-adolescence.

During the "Green Week" campaign, participants learned about recycling, the use of green energy, and environmental protection, taking part in civic actions to collect old electrical equipment, electronics, and household appliances.

We also partnered with the Public Health Directorate for an information session on eating disorders. Through the "Warm Coat for a Child" campaign, we highlighted the profound impact of poverty on young lives and raised funds to purchase winter jackets.











Civic and artistic engagement were also promoted through the drawing and painting contest "How I See My Community in the Future", which mobilised 50 children and young people to creatively express their vision for local development.

The "3R – Recycle, Recreate, Responsibility" project brought together 45 families, 52 teenagers and 100 primary school children in a comprehensive environmental education initiative that combined awareness-raising, hands-on learning and public involvement.

The "Art and Colour" exhibition celebrated young talent, featuring works by three visual artists, including a student supported through the Tackling Poverty Through Education programme, who was awarded by the Suceava Department of Culture – a meaningful act of recognition and encouragement for his artistic vocation.

We also took part in two meetings with teaching staff to highlight the significant progress made by children at risk of dropping out of school, and to collaboratively define the best strategies for supporting school attendance, behaviour, and motivation for learning.

On Earth Day, we engaged the community in awareness activities on environmental issues affecting our planet and the impact of resource use on population health.
