30th Anniversary

Since 1991, Jane never stopped to bring a critical contribution that changed many lives of the most vulnerable, in a society that despite its aspiration to evolve into a democracy of the twentieth century failed so many times many children, youth and those affected by



poverty. The 30 years of activity have been translated in over 10,000 lives transformed and improved, and over 300 jobs created. Jane continues her mission today with a team that becomes every year stronger and stronger through people - professionals, beneficiaries, partners, volunteers, and supporters. The 30 years of activity and the leadership model promoted by Jane Nicholson inspire us to seek and find the best way to fulfil the mission, vision and ideals of FARA Foundation and its people, and to turn the unknown into solutions to complex equations of life that challenge us to explore the world as it is, to experiment, and to find solutions for opening new horizons.

FARA transforms the lives of the most vulnerable and disadvantaged children, young people, and families in Romania, giving them a sense of "family"

Our **Vision** is of a world in which everyone can live with freedom and dignity in a loving, protective environment, experiencing fulfilled lives whatever their ability.

Our **Mission** is to transform the lives of the most vulnerable and disadvantaged children, youth and families living in Romania's poorest communities.

Our **Values** underpin all our work and are shared by all those involved in carrying out our mission both in the UK and Romania.

FARA strives to build a just society serving the common good, based on Christian values of love, justice, dignity and respect, welcoming people of all faiths and none.

30 years of experience in caring for vulnerable children, young people, and families in Romania. FARA has been supporting the most vulnerable and disadvantaged in Romania since 1991.

FARA goes far beyond being just a care provider, family and friendships are at the heart of what we do. We try to create a true sense of belonging. Our mission is to build communities and families and to love and serve them. Our work is life changing for many families living in abject poverty.

FARA today is one of the largest and most experienced NGO care providers in Romania, reaching out to the poor, the marginalised and most discriminated in society. FARA's projects fund, develop and manage services providing care, security, and love to improve the quality of life and opportunity.







The FARA Foundation aims to be a family for those without. We focus our efforts and demonstrate by action that we love, serve, and invest in those most in need of support, to help alleviate trauma among marginalized children, youth, and adults, to give hope, and to help them achieve their dreams. find answers and resources for building the future.

A FAMILY FOR LIFE - Homes for life

We provide residency, psycho-social assistance, non-formal education and socialization in sheltered family-type housing, in two locations in Suceava County (St. Mary Home, Vadu Moldovei and Elisabeth Home, Cacica) for 20 young adults with disabilities.

SUPPORT FOR INDEPENDENT LIFE - Youth at risk

We provide integrated services and psycho-social and educational support for young people leaving the protection system and vulnerable young people in the community who are preparing for independent living. The capacity of the program is 80 young people, and in 2021, 117 young people benefited from services in two transit centers, Francis in Popeşti Leordeni, (Ilfov County), Foyer in Satu Mare and communities.

THERAPY AND RECOVERY

We provide therapy and recovery services, free of charge, in three Day Centers, one in Popeşti Leordeni (Ilfov County) and two in Suceava County (Suceava and Fălticeni), for 240 children and young people with disabilities from psychosocially vulnerable families and financial. In this program we also support parents in continuing the therapeutic process at home.

Takling POVERTY THROUGH EDUCATION - TPTE

We provide after-school educational support, non-formal education, psychosocial and material support, social inclusion activities for disadvantaged and / or marginalized children and their family members living in Baia, Bogata, Basarabi and Bahna Arini, Suceava County. The capacity of the program is 300 children and 450 members of their families.

A FAMILY FOR THE WITHOUT – Family type home

We provide residence, psycho-social assistance, non-formal education and socialization in a family-type home, St. Nicholas, in Suceava, for 15 children and young people from the protection system, without support and parental and family care.











Impact & Results

FARA Foundation grows with its beneficiaries.

The desire to transform the lives of our beneficiaries and to remove the barriers to their development, challenges us to continually improve, be creative, and find viable solutions.

We believe in people, in their ideas and in their ability to push their limits. We enter into partnerships with those who believe in our cause and, through their contribution, amplify the impact of our initiatives.







Homes for life

This program represents the opportunity offered by FARA to young people with disabilities to live in a family climate, to participate in activities aimed at developing and strengthening personal resilience and skills for independent living. Homes for Life program is based on the strong belief that we are all equal and we all have the right to live our life with dignity. Little things done with love and perseverance can change lives.

20 young people of the two homes for life participated in 21 events held in the community for integrative purposes.

The health of our young people comes first, so over 60 doctor visits were facilitated for the 20 beneficiaries in 2021.

Emotional balance in sensitive situations was ensured through 34 psychological counseling sessions.

The young people volunteered for the Good Homes Change Lives project, developed and implemented by Brico Depot, to renovate and improve the spaces in which they work and live.

The young people from the two homes for life volunteered in the activities of organizing and distributing food packages for the additional 40 people with disabilities living in the community. This activity was part of the Support SustainAbility project, funded by the Suceava local council. All participated in counseling sessions and creative workshops.

Youth Program: Independent Living Support







The Youth Program: Independent Living Support (ILSP) provides a package of support services for a successful transition to adulthood. ILSP provides young people with a positive life experience in a supervised environment, where they are exposed to opportunities to develop independent living skills.

By engaging in self-management, non-formal education, counseling, mentoring, school and career guidance, and connecting to community support networks, the FARA team helps young people strengthen their resilience and build their future.

Therapy & Recovery

The day centers in the Therapy and Recovery program have a strong and measurable impact on the individual level of the beneficiary, on the family level and on the community level through the technical training, professionalism and level of involvement of our teams. Due to the fact that the services offered are free and the demand is growing, our presence in the communities where we operate is fundamental, clearly contributing to the integration of children with disabilities in the mainstream education system and in Romanian society, contributing to a country with richer human capital. The diversity of services offered allows a broad and complete approach to children who cross our threshold.

The moments of gratitude are offered by the parents of the beneficiaries, who are involved daily in the continuation of the therapy at home, under the guidance of the therapists.

In 2021, we are proud to obtain the operating license of the Rafael and St. Teresa day recovery centers, as well as the relicensing at the Emanuel center.

25 children benefited from Pony and Horse Therapy, carried out on a private farm in Suceava, under the guidance of our therapists.

Online therapy has proven to be an alternative with positive implications for child recovery. In this period of pandemic caused by COVID-19, all centers have the capacity to offer the services to the beneficiaries through the online environment as well.

Takling Poverty through Education







The program promotes respect for the rights of the child, access to education, social inclusion, reduction of inequities by ensuring a favorable family and community climate, which allows to reach the maximum potential for development, thus generating opportunities for social integration.

Individualized interventions in poverty-stricken communities aim to prevent early school leaving, reduce barriers to school performance, and increase access to development opportunities for equal opportunities in school and socio-professional life.

35 families received construction materials for the renovation of houses with high degrees of wear, endangering the lives of tenants, and 2 families were supported to increase the quality of life by access to water (construction of fountains).

Medical services offered to a number of 78 direct and indirect beneficiaries, in the form of medical consultations, medical prescriptions, facilitation of obtaining rights, in particular the acquisition of certificates of disability, medicines, dental interventions, medical tests.

The 289 preschool and primary school beneficiaries from the two communes come from 246 families. The total number of parents / extended family / siblings totals 1240 members and represents indirect beneficiaries, supported to solve social or family problems.







A Family for Those Without

The "St. Nicholas" home is the first program developed by the FARA Foundation and one of the first private residential service in Romania. The opening of the home in 1997 marked the natural step that the founder of the FARA Foundation, Jane Nicholson, initiated to support abandoned children in public institutions, based on her experience of 6 years of volunteering in Romania. Through personalized services and intervention plans, this program provides children with the proper family type environment for physical, mental, cognitive-emotional development. The purpose is to build the resilience needed to overcome the trauma caused by abandonment, abuse, poverty and neglect. In the long term, the program envisions the development of independent living skills including priority-settings and life plans and providing the necessary support to facilitate socio-educational, professional and community integration.

10 000 lives transformed

In 2021, FARA Foundation celebratet 30 years since Jane Nicholson, a British citizen, came to Romania. With her love for people, Jane found resources to help the children who were suffering then in the tragic conditions in the Romanian orphanages and set up the FARA Foundation. Through fundraising and volunteer activities in the UK and the responsible work of the Romanian team, FARA Foundation has transformed the lives of over 10 000 vulnerable children and young people, young adults with disabilities from state institutions or families from poor communities in Suceava, Ilfov and Satu Mare counties.

On July 14, at the Citadel of Suceava, the Mayor of Suceava, Mr. Ion Lungu awarded the title of Honorary Citizen of Suceava to the Founder of FARA Foundation, Jane Nicholson, for all her efforts, near and far, for giving a real chance to those without a voice, a family or love and opportunities, for a future in which they can decide for themselves what is the best for them.



The story of the FARA Foundation began in 1997 in the city of Suceava, when Jane founded the first family-type house, St. Nicholas, where children without parental care and love found a family-type environment in which they could develop healthy emotionally, physically and mentally.

Given the acute needs of the most vulnerable categories of children and young people, FARA continued to develop and implement its programs in the counties of Suceava, Ilfov and Satu Mare. Currently, 2000 direct and indirect beneficiaries are supported by 104 employees. The FARA team help them overcome barriers, in particular the limited access to opportunities for education and developement due to school drop-out, lack of/ poor parental care, financial vulnerability of the family and daily challanges caused by disabilites.

The efforts of FARA team would not have an impact without the willingness of local authorities to collaborate, share experiences and knowledge with other NGOs. Our work is built on mobilizing and coordinating local, national and international resources and the permanent involvement of members of the communities in which we operate.



Our future plans include the opening of a community service centre in Preutești dedicated to vulnerable children and families. The aim of this community centre is to provide integrated services and support to children and young people in the educational process and guidance to their families in order to reduce social vulnerability, alleviate inequities and increase social inclusion. Raising awareness, engaging beneficiaries in finding solutions for their problems and mobilizing society can reduce the effects of poverty at the individual, family and community levels. This strategic objective remains one of our priorities.










Fundraising & Communication

Donations, grants, campaigns and social projects contribute to essential changes in the lives of vulnerable people at FARA.

These changes mean more than just providing basic necessities — housing, food, clothing, warmth, or supplies — they means hope and faith in a safer future and providing an environment that allows for a healthy development mentally and emotionally.

2021 was a fruitful year and full of interesting projects. Together with good people and socially involved organizations, at FARA we have managed to make important changes for our beneficiaries through fundraising, communication and advocacy campaigns.



Through the Good Homes change lives project, FARA receiving funding to improve living conditions, safety and quality of life in disadvantaged communities.

With the help of the funding received, we have completed the renovation, construction, modernization, increase of functionality and improvement of the spaces where our beneficiaries, children, young people and young adults live / carry out activities.

Titi, the children's favourite beaver, has been put up for sale in all Auchan hypermarkets to support children in marginalized rural areas! The first half of the TITI Campaign had results in such a way we did not even hope to dream of, over 440,000 lei from the sales of fluffy plush, went to the TPTE program. The Titi campaign continues in 2022, and we hope that Titi will become a symbol of the solidarity that the new generations learn from young children.





The Morning Glory, Morning Glory, Sustinem toti Juniory campaign on Rock FM, organized in partnership with Auchan, launched a collection of personalized T-shirts and mugs with the famous expressions and jokes of Răzvan Exarhu, to support the children from FARA. Over 56,000 lei were redirected to FARA, at the end of the year, the campaign continuing in 2022.



The December Story Campaign organized for the fulfillment of Christmas dreams took place between November 10 and December 15, 2021, with enough time to load the gifts in Santa's bag for the over 700 children who are helped by FARA Foundation. The Christmas campaign was an absolute success with 700+ gifts donated from people with great souls, for the good children at FARA. The culmination of our campaign is the Christmas festivities, where the children meet Santa Claus and receive gifts from the heart!



We dance, sing and raise awareness. The flashmob in the central esplanade "Nada Florilor" in Fălticeni stormed the monotony of the day and electrified passers-by, inviting them to dance. The event was a success, organized by the staff of the St. Teresa Day Centre and with the support of the municipality of Fălticeni, to proudly mark the 30th anniversary of FARA but also to raise awareness in the community of Fălticeni about the children with disabilities that we support. Children, educators, parents, friends and passers-by enjoyed the musical hits and were guided in choreography by Caterina Moldovanu Feraru.



To mark the 10th anniversary of the Emanuel Day Center, the doors of the center were opened for 9 weeks in a virtual tour. It was intended to provide a better understanding of our therapies and activities, as well as the importance they have in recovering children with disabilities.
