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1. Message from the EXECUTIVE TEAM





In 2022 we continued the process of organizational transformation started two years ago. Over the past two years we worked hard to become an organization

with a stronger voice and visibility able to translate over 30 years of experience of working in Romania into better programs to improve lives for those who were previously denied it, whether through poverty, disability, or social exclusion. Despite the many challenges, both personally and professionally throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, you all have continued to show up for children, youth, people with disabilities and families, and for that, we want to thank you.

Reflecting on the past, we remember that at the beginning of this change journey we started with an honest acknowledgement of how hard the work will be, how much capacity and discipline the organization will need along with the individual professional commitment of all members of FARA family to build resilience and sustainability in our work. Now is a good time to take stock; to reflect on where we've been, what we've done, and where we're at.

By its nature, change creates disruptions, tensions, and uncertainties. As with any change process, our experience has also been a difficult journey which involved a steep learning curve, out-of-box thinking, lots of reflection and analysis, creativity, innovation, and the need to rapidly adapt to new ways of how we talk and do our work. Probably, the most meaningful learning so far is that we are now more aware of the importance of creating a safe environment filled with trust, free of stereotypes, friendly, and positive, so that both staff and beneficiaries can express what they think without fear of being judged or misunderstood.

Multifaceted transformational change as is the case of our organization needs to be appropriately scoped, resourced, and most importantly, integrated. Every initiative must be linked to every other initiative, that is why we placed a great importance on synergies among various programs. Everyone worked very hard to reposition programs and services and maximize their impact on the well-being of our beneficiaries. We are all striving for demonstrating professionalism, excellence and high quality of our interventions. We worked hard to sync our ideals with the realities of operations – people, resources, and an increasing demand for services due to the magnitude of poverty, disability, marginalization, unequal chances, discrimination, and limited access to opportunities and community resources.

We trust you have a sense for how hard the organizational transformation will continue to be. The unforeseen obstacles we will face will test our endurance and optimism. Do the necessary work to prepare yourself and your programs for this continued journey. The one obstacle you can best prevent from derailing transformation is yourself.

Fundatia FARA is striving for continuous improvement of quality of services and excellence in service delivery. That is why we allocated time and resources to properly review the impact of our programs, the intervention models and the rapidly changing needs of our primary beneficiaries – children in the protection system without parental care, children with disabilities, children affected by poverty, abuse, exploitation, discrimination, bullying, and other forms of violence, and adults with disabilities. We are proud to report that united in a common cause a team of 100 dedicated professionals provided services and supports to an average of 1,150 unique beneficiaries monthly. We all touched their lives for better in ways that it is difficult to capture even by the most experienced evaluators. We offered emotional support and guidance to help them find the best solutions to their circumstances, build their individual resilience, and make better decisions for their lives. We celebrated and had fun together with our beneficiaries during our creative events and recreational activities. We provided material and financial support whenever resources where available and needs were identified. We exposed them to learning opportunities, new creative and innovative projects, and multiple activities that focused on giving them a chance to have their voice heard and considered. We facilitated access to specialized services when our competencies were not sufficient. We worked, laughed, and cried together with our beneficiaries each time life struggles came into our way.

On February 25th, Fundaţia FARA created the Solidarity Team for Ukraine to provide essential material support and psychological assistance to the Ukrainian refugees, children and families transiting through Vama Siret, Suceava. This humanitarian project started with the provision of basic material support (personal hygiene kits, disinfectants and COVID prevention kits, warm clothing, footwear, food, first aid kits, over the counter medical supplies. The assistance rapidly expanded to help the Ukrainian refugees settled in Rădăuţi, Fălticeni, Iaşi, Jijila, Constanţa, Popeşti Leordeni, Bucharest, and Ploieşti. Our staff, volunteers, partners, and donors played a major role in bringing hope and support to over 12,200 refugees dealing with loss, panic, anxiety, fear, trauma, and desperation and fighting for their survival on the Romanian territory, and for many more in Ukraine.

On the note of gratitude, we would like to take a moment to thank each of you for everything you are doing to support our people – staff, volunteers, partners, and foremost, our beneficiaries and their families. Regardless of where you work in Fundaţia FARA or what you do, ultimately, your work contributes to the health and robustness of our organization. Your work is critical to our overall success as an organization. At every turn, everything we do, should in some way contribute to a better life for the vulnerable people we serve. Let's focus on being accountable for our actions and be the FARA family that we are seeking to be. We are all part of the best possible group of professionals to make their professional dreams a reality through actions and good faith.

DARE: Development, Skills, Resilience and Equity for an independent life for people with disabilities

Implementation: March 1, 2022 to August 31, 2023

Beneficiaries are people with disabilities who have gone through the experience of institutionalization and who decide to build their destiny in the community, as well as people with disabilities who live in the community. This project provides individualized support tailored to their needs, helps them to develop autonomy and the ability to responsibly build an independent life in community where they pay their rent, utilities, maintain their home, cook, develop a social support network.











The DARE project addresses the continuing shortage of services for people with disabilities, both in the residential system and those at risk of (re) institutionalization. It is aligned with the objectives of the 2021-2027 National Strategy on the rights of persons with disabilities. Key components are:

- Promotion of flexible standards for regulating the functioning of social services for adults with disabilities;
- Piloting a new service the Supervised Independent Living Service (STIS) to increase resilience and social inclusion and reduce inequities. This service is intended to provide a safety net for people with disabilities in search of autonomy and a fulfilling life in the community.
- · Intensification of advocacy activities to increase the visibility of life experiences of people with disabilities
- Coordination of resources by capitalizing on the experience of non-governmental organizations, professionals, and people with disabilities for social inclusion.
- Increase participation of people with disabilities in making decisions that affect their lives.

SafetyNet: Training, Networking and Best Practices for safety, security and quality of services for children

Implementation: August 1st 2022 – 30 June, 2023

SafetyNet is an advocacy project aiming at creating an international network of professionals in the field of protecting and promoting children's rights.

Key components are:

Create a virtual platform targeting professionals from Romania, France and other EU and non-EU countries in the field of protection of children's rights and prevention of any form of child abuse, exploitation, and neglect.

Create a space for dialogue, exchange of experience, and debates to promote sharing of knowledge, information and best practices among children, youth and professionals working in the national and international sphere of child rights.

Stimulate children and youth participation in advocacy activities to prevent and eliminate all forms of abuse, exploitation, neglect and violence, and to have their voices heard.





Key Achievements:

- SafetyNet launch conference (20+ participants, guest speaker children's representative who shared children's perspective on zero tolerance for abuse, exploitation, violence and humiliating treatments in the school and community).
- Brochure on Zero Tolerance of Abuse, Exploitation, Violence and Humiliating Treatment at home, at school and within the community.
- 65 highschool youth from the TPTE program and St. Nicolae's House, students of the Social Assistance University and teaching staff participated in a seminary "The Voice of Children" focusing on issues faced by children and teens in the residential system, in the community and in the family, organized in partnership with Stefan Cel Mare University in Suceava.
- 15 teenagers from the TPTE program participated in a debate on "Social involvement of teenagers to prevent humiliating treatment of socially vulnerable children." ASPIRE aims to improve quality and access to services for 91 vulnerable children, youth, people with disabilities, families and impoverished communities, with the funding being directed to:

- Prevent school drop-out and improve academic performance.
- Build resilience through independent life skills development.
- Helping vulnerable youth to start living independently.
- Combat poverty through education and continuous support.
- Increase employability and support the development of skill sets required for jobs in a technological driven work environment.
- Provide free of charge therapy for children with disability.
- Support the development of healthy lifestyle.
- Amplifying beneficiaries' voice in decisions about housing, care, health, safety, education, leisure, finance, and employment.


SRU: Solidarity with the Ukrainian Refugees

On February 25th, Fundaţia FARA created the Solidarity Team for Ukraine to provide essential material support and psychological assistance to the Ukrainian refugees, children and families transiting through Vama Siret, Suceava, Romania searching for help in the camps and mobile centers for refugees in Suceava county or aiming to reach their destination elsewhere in Europe or in North America.

Our staff, volunteers, partners, and donors played a major role in bringing hope and support to over 12,200 refugees dealing with loss, panic, anxiety, fear, trauma, and desperation and fighting for their survival on the Romanian territory, and for many more in Ukraine.

This humanitarian project started with the provision of basic material support (personal hygiene kits, disinfectants and COVID prevention kits, warm clothing, footwear, food, first aid kits, over the counter medical supplies. The assistance rapidly expanded to help the Ukrainian refugees settled in Rădăuţi, Fălticeni, Iaşi, Jijila, Constanţa, Popeşti Leordeni, Bucharest, and Ploieşti.

Humanitarian aid was also provided to people of Ukraine in their own communities in the middle of the war. Fundaţia FARA has been a major ally of important public and nongovernmental entities supporting the Ukrainian refugees.



The year 2022 was marked by the closing of the residential component of the program (transit centres for careleavers youth). Support for independent living component was integrated in all core programs targgeting vulnerable children and youth living with their families affected by poverty, children with disabilities from the community, young people with disabilities from our Homes for Life, people with disabilities from families/communities affected by poverty, and children/youth in alternative care (St. Nicholas Home). Activities provide beneficiaries with a learning experience in a supervised environment where they are exposed to opportunities to develop independent living skills.



4. Innovation & Creativity

With the funding and support of Carrefour Romania and its volunteers, Fundația FARA started the project "Carrefour Academy. Health, Education and Therapy for children and young people with disabilities" having three main directions:

Health

Education

Therapy

Establishing therapeutic gardens by planting and growing vegetables, perennial and aromatic flowers, we build places of peace and for the study of plants. We organize, together with nutritionists, psychologists and paediatricians, informational and educational activities so that healthy food is part of the usual therapeutic program, to achieve well-being in all aspects related to the physical and mental health of our beneficiaries.

Children and young people with disabilities participated in cooking workshops, gathering medicinal plants, and preparing them to be used in natural therapies.

Main activities

- # building therapeutic gardens.
- # supporting the study and collection of medicinal plants and their preparation for use in **natural therapies**
- # providing access to nutrition education, cooking workshops, and occupational therapy through cooking and gardening
- encouraging professional activities in the garden/greenhouse and compost preparation

Brico Depot and the Foundation with the same name joined efforts and worked together with FARA's community to renovate and modernize the multifunctional Community Centre. The vision is that this service will have the following areas of activity:

Preventing school dropout through formal and informal education (after-school program, workshops, summer school, experiential learning projects using technology)

Developing of independent living skills for different categories of beneficiaries (children with disabilities, children from poor families, people with disabilities, young people) through Do It Yourself workshops

Developing the skills and resilience of parents of children with disabilities to improve parents' understanding of their child's disability, their pace of development, rehabilitation pathways, etc.

Providing timely support to vulnerable families in the community through mobile teams

Creating a resource center for professionals to promote the rights of children and persons with disabilities, reduce marginalization and discrimination, and support social inclusion.

Piloting a respiro service for children and people with disabilities

The purpose of the multifunctional center is to offer integrated, personalized services to ensure equal opportunities for vulnerable children and young people and people with disabilities

The year 2022 was a year in which the collaboration with the FARA Foundation materialized in renovation and rehabilitation projects of the Therapy and Recovery Day Center for disabled children as well as the Multifunctional Community Center in Popeşti Leordeni, in support offered to refugees from Ukraine consisting of accommodation, food and essentials, advice and legal support. We are also happy that Brico employees actively participated in supporting the children and young people protected in the FARA centers, by getting involved in volunteer actions or in the second editions of the internal fair "Give the gift of a good deed", offering gifts and material support for a decent living."

Healthy Food Connect aims at capitalizing on rurality as an opportunity for agricultural practice through microfarming, education, occupational therapy, encouragement of healthy eating and production of home-grown vegetables, fruits, and breeding poultry.

Healthy Food Connect

The project helped to cultivate 1000 sam vegetable gardens, 100 sam greenhouses, plant 100 trees, build 2 coops and populate them with 25 hens and 3 roosters. It also helped 15 low-income families with gardening materials and logistical support to ensure information sharing, building capacity, and hands-on experience.
